## The Underlying Issue

Under all the confusing layers of accusation and retort, of claims and counter-claims, of issues social, and political, and ecumenical, and personal—when one digs down to the very bottom—he finds the underlying issue in all the divisions in the Church today. That rock-bottom issue is one's attitude toward the Bible.

Has God spoken? Has He caused His mind and will for the Church to be committed to writing? Do the words of the Bible—in their construction and combination with relevant words, clauses, sentences—represent God's very own revelation to mankind?

There can be no doubt that the Westminster Confession of Faith gives a clear, **affirmative** answer to such questions. There can be no doubt, further, that the Bible's own testimony to the Scriptures is that they, in their entirety (all 66 books), and in detail (all the words) are the very Word of God. As John Calvin says, “. . . the Scriptures are the only records in which God has been pleased to Consign His truth . . . The full authority which they ought to possess with the faithful is not recognized unless they are believed to have come from heaven, as directly as if God had been heard giving utterance to them.” (**Institutes** I-7)

This is the view of the Bible which God's people have firmly held since the beginning. And no wonder, since God's people believe the Bible (Westminster Confession XVI-2) and the Bible teaches that it is directly inspired by the Holy Spirit. This inspiration was such a superintendance of the Holy Spirit over the writers of the Scriptures, that their writings possess Divine authority and trustworthiness, and are therefore free from error.

And, let's face it, it seems that the majority of the leaders in our denomination are mighty uncomfortable with this view of the Bible, these days. Their official and semi-official pronouncements, actions, and literature provide ample evidence to prove conclusively that the traditional, Reformed views are no longer adhered to.

For instance, the **Layman's Bible Commentary** tells the reader that the stories of Genesis 1-11 are not historically, literally true, that the story of Jonah is a parable and not fact, that the Bible indeed contains many errors.

The Covenant Life Curriculum lumps the Old Testament wisdom literature with the wise sayings of Robert Kennedy or Winston Churchill, declares

that all men will eventually be saved, suggests that not all the commandments in the Bible are necessarily God's, and teaches that Jesus and Mark, Luke, and Paul are in contradiction on the concept of divorce.

A John Knox Press book, **The Westminster Confession for Today**, declares that the Westminster Confession “fails to discern the actual pattern” of the being of God and therefore describes “another God.” In the same book the author denies the satisfaction view of Christ's atonement, scouts the idea of merit in conjunction with justification, and ~~denies~~ <sup>declares</sup> the doctrine of the immortality of the soul is derived ~~that~~ from Plato!

Is the Bible true or isn't it? That's the issue. By whom shall we be led? What is our standard of authority, Whom shall we trust?

Conservatives are committed to the living and true God. He is Truth. God cannot lie; all His ways are truth. If we know God, we know the truth; but we know God only through His revelation and specifically through His Word. The Word of God is the truth, and if we know God, we know His Word as the truth. When men speak of knowing God and the truth that He is apart from the word of revelation which is incorporated in Scripture, they deal with mere abstractions which have no meaning and no relevance. True Christians, who are of the truth and know the truth find in the written words of the Bible the living voice of God.

We must be led by God alone. We can be assured that we are led by God only when our lives are ordered by the infallible standard of the Bible, the true Word of God. We trust only the living God, who speaks the truth.

When the General Assembly, synods, presbyteries, sessions, and individual churchmen begin to insist that their members and brethren take seriously the Biblical and Confessional view of Scripture, then the issue will be settled and we will have a large measure of peace in the Church. But not 'til then. Peace will not be enjoyed until purity is secured. And purity cannot be had until all the life of the Church is shaped by the living Word of God—the Holy Scriptures.

When we get right down to it, this is the issue.

## The Unfailing Test of Orthodoxy

“. . . although (the Romanists) exhibit a temple, a priesthood, and other similar masks, the empty glare by which they dazzle the eyes of the simple should **not** move us in the least to admit that there is a Church **where the word of God appears not**. The Lord furnished us with an unfailing test when he said, ‘Every one that is of the truth heareth my voice’ (John 18:37).

“Christ has designated (the true Church) by a sign in which is nothing in the least degree equivocal . . . the existence of which infallibly proves the existence of the Church, while its absence proves the absence of everything that properly bears the name of the Church. Paul declares that the Church is not founded either upon the judgments of men or the priesthood, but upon the **doctrine** of the Apostles and Prophets (Eph. 2:20). Nay, . . . the Church of Christ is to be distinguished by the discriminating test which our Saviour has applied, ‘He that is of God heareth God’s words: ye therefore hear them not, because ye are not of God’ (John 8:47). In short, since the Church is the kingdom of Christ, and **he reigns only by His word**, can there be any doubt as to the falsehood of those statements, by which the kingdom of Christ is represented without His sceptre, in other words, without His sacred word?

“The name of heretics and schismatics is applied to those who, by dissenting from the Church, destroy its communion. This communion is held together by two chains—viz: consent in sound doctrine and brotherly charity. But the thing to be observed is, that this union of charity so depends on unity of faith, as to have in it its beginning, its end, in fine, its only rule. Let us therefore remember, that whenever ecclesiastical unity is commended to us, the thing required is, that while our minds consent **in Christ**, our wills also be united together by mutual good-will **in Christ**. Accordingly, Paul . . . when he tells us to be ‘of one accord, of one mind,’ immediately adds, ‘Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus’ (Phil. 2:2, 5); intimating, that **where the word of the Lord is not**, it is not a union of believers, but a faction of the ungodly.

“Accordingly, (Cyprian) declares that when heresies and schisms arise, it is because men return not to the origin of the truth, because they seek not the head, because they keep not the doctrine of the heavenly Master.

“Let them . . . clamour against us . . . for having withdrawn . . . since the only cause of our estrangement is, that they cannot tolerate a pure profession of the truth.

“. . . to me it is enough that we behoved to withdraw from them in order to draw near to Christ.”

- Conservative commissioners to the 112th. General Assembly meeting in Montreat, June 11-16, will find a spiritual oasis in the conservative fellowship headquarters located at Camp Fairley, just up Look-out Mt. road from Anderson Auditorium. A prayer room, frequent testimonies to God’s grace, counsel on Assembly issues, light refreshments, cots for catnaps, and a PA hookup to the Assembly floor are among the services provided for anyone desiring a spiritual pick-up during the week. Mrs. Paul Settle (Georgia) will be the hostess. Ken Smartt, Jack Williamson, Paul Settle, and John Richards will be on hand to greet those who drop in.

- You may have heard that conservatives captured the convention of proposed Synod “F” on May 16. A great turn-out by Ruling Elders, coupled with expert leadership, resulted in a resounding triumph for those unhappy with restructuring and the general trends in the denomination away from Biblical faith. Dr Robert Strong was elected Chairman of the Convention by a vote of 278-162 over Massey Mott Heltzel. A slate of conservative nominees for committee posts was adopted *in toto*, and the convention, by a vote of 293-139, turned down an invitation to merge with proposed Synod “C” (Kentucky, Tennessee). The convention also adopted a resolution opposing the abolition of synods (because this would give to the General Assembly the power to change presbytery boundaries).

- Dr. Ben Rose (the Assembly’s moderator) and the Council on Church and Society have called on the government of the U. S. to stop the killing in Indochina, and have appealed to the President and the Congress “to declare that as of a date certain—no later than Dec. 31, 1972—the U. S. government will supply no more military forces or aid for the war in Indochina.” This appeal was made following the statement that “the moral imperative to stop the killing . . . now outweighs the moral claim of the U. S. government’s commitment to the Saigon regime . . .” PCUS leaders joining in a protest of the bombing of North Vietnam included: Ben Lacy Rose and George A. Chauncey.

- Savannah Presbytery recently adopted a resolution “deploring” the “schismatic tendencies” of groups calling for withdrawal from the denomination and called on Sessions to “discourage the activities of dissident groups.”

- Asheville Presbytery joined Augusta-Macon Presbytery in asking the General Assembly to declare that the church’s standards “do indeed teach the plenary verbal inspiration of Holy Scripture.”
